

Vicar's Message: “Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight” (Luke.24:31)
Dearly beloved in Christ,

The Great Lent is almost over and during the lent we meditate specially on the passion we meditate specially on the passion, the death and resurrection of Christ which speak clearly of God’s inestimable love to human beings. “For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son..... (John.3:16). Thanking God for enabling us to set apart this time for prayer, meditations, Bible study and fasting. As we attend the special services during the Passion Week, which culminate with Easter Sunday, let us challenged by the invitation of Jesus to “take up cross”. Church being the body of Christ is called to appropriate the challenges of Cross in its ministerial pursuits. Here I would like to quote Pope Francis' words about Church, “I prefer a Church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security”.

Cross and empty tomb fills us with hope. When crucified and risen Christ joined two disciples on the road to Emmaus, they were grieving over His death. “But we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel” (Luke.24:21), they told Jesus, whom they didn't recognize. Later they realized they had been talking with Jesus. He was alive! When our dreams are shattered and our hearts are broken, we may feel that all has been lost and nothing has been gained. It takes the touch of God to open our eyes to the glory of His plan. In our times of loss, the risen Lord comes to us with comfort and peace, revealing his glory and eternal gain that is ours. Present pains can lead to permanent gains.

The first Resurrection Day began with gloom and despair for the disciples. We can imagine them huddled together behind closed doors as “they mourned and wept” (Mark.16:10). But John told us that before the day ended the disciples “were glad “(John.20:20). From mourning in the morning to gladness in the evening. What made the difference? Seeing their resurrected Lord made all the difference. It transformed mourning in to gladness, weeping in to joy. We too can have great reason to be filled with joyous, anticipation and hope as we confront real painful life experiences.

Let us pray in the words of Psalms.55:1-15-17 which says, O Lords open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God You will not despise.

May the Holy Spirit enable us to experience the transforming power of Resurrection in our lives so that we can lead a life with risen Christ, and become a witness of His Resurrection.

“The Lord is raised! He is risen indeed!”

Cross the symbol of unfailing love

Jean Val jean, a convict on parole, coming to a town where the only person who'll give him a room and a meal is the local bishop, Bp Myriel. The bishop welcomes him into his house, feeds him and gives him a warm bed for the night. However, the riches of the bishop's house prove too much for Jean Val jean. He succumbs to temptation and steals the bishop's silver cutlery. He's soon apprehended, though, and when the gendarmes bring him back, the bishop is faced with a dilemma: should he tell the truth, that Jean Val jean has stolen the silver, in which case he'll be thrown back into prison, or should he show him the mercy of the gospel and make out that it was given to him as a gift? The choice he has to make is between mercy and justice. He can't have both. Well, as you probably know, he chooses mercy. He lies to the gendarmes. He says that the silver was a gift. In fact he insists that Jean Val jean takes not just the silver cutlery, but his silver candlesticks as well. But before Jean Val jean leaves, he's told that this gift of love requires a response. From now on he must reform his life, from now on he must begin to live as a law-abiding citizen.

What is the story of the cross? Why do we observe cross as the symbol of Christian spirituality?

We are once again in the Lenten season where we observe the passion of our Lord Jesus. Jesus gave us this beautiful symbol as the centre of our spirituality which always challenges us with the unfailing and unfathomable love of God, which he expresses through the cross. In the Old Testament we see a God who accompanies a murderer, who hears the cry of the little child in the wilderness, who loves his people who always prostituted their master, who marries an unfaithful wife, and finally sending his own son to die to conquer death. This love continues through the symbol of the cross. Once again we are meditating on this unfailing love which comes from the everlasting fountain of the cross of Jesus and that is our hope in this world of individualism and 'lovelessness'. The one thing that takes us forward in the world of hatred, retaliation, jealousy and selfishness is the love that flows from this fountain.

If God loves us like this, what should be our response to this cross? The hymn writer Frances Havergal is asking these words to us

“I gave My life for thee, My precious blood I shed,
That thou might ransomed be, and raised up from the dead
I gave, I gave My life for thee, what hast thou given for Me?
I gave, I gave My life for thee, what hast thou given for Me?”

What is our response? Let this season of prayer and lent help us to fathom this fountain of love. Let this season takes us closer to Him.
