Treasure in the jars of clay

"But we have this treasure in jars of clay" 2 Corinthians 4: 7

Paul in his letter to Corinthians presents himself as a Jar of clay. He is of the opinion that it is the best way to explain who a Christian is. But he says even though the jar is made of clay but still God kept a treasure in this. In the first century context many people kept their treasures, especially their coins in a clay jars and kept inside the ground so that they can keep their treasure safely from Wars and robberies. In that context Paul explained this great spiritual thought to explain who a Christian is. When we study this concept I think three concepts are to be discussed

Creativity

A clay jar is always a creation of a creator. Every potter who makes a vessel has an intention when he makes it. So for that purpose he/she designs that vessel. So every vessel has a purpose that the creator intended for that Jar. In Jeremiah chapter 18 we read about a potter who molds the clay according to his will and wish for a particular purpose. Paul is saying every Christian is a jar of clay which was molded by our creator, the almighty God. When he designed us like this He has a special purpose in us. We live in this world to fulfill that purpose.

Fragility

The second word that we need to remember when we think about the jars of clay is fragility. Human is a fragile being and God has taken a risk to keep the treasure in that fragile jar. Just like any other clay jar every human is prone to many destructing experiences in life. But Paul explains that in verse 8 and 9; "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; 9 persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed.". But those who have this treasure at our clay jars we will have the assurance that we will not be destroyed even though we face all kinds of difficulties in our lives.

Humility

This word reminds us about another aspect when we think about jars of clay. God came down into this form of clay jars to identify with everyone one. Philippians chapter 2 " though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God, He made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant being made in human likeness being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death even death on a cross!" This clay jars remind us about the humbleness of Jesus and challenge us to follow the life style of humility. We are once again on the Advent season. Christmas is always reminding us about this humility where Jesus became human to redeem this whole world. When we celebrate Christmas this year let us remember that God became jar clay to bring this Gospel to us.

God has placed this treasure, the gospel in our clay jars. So we are the clay jars and we need to remember who our creator is and what purpose in this world is. We must understand how fragile we are but still under the protection of God almighty our creator. And also this clay jars reminds us about the about the humility that we need to have in our lives to imitate the life style of Jesus. God wants to place this treasure in our clay Jars. But are we ready to carry it in our lives.

Dear Friends in Christ,

According to our church calendar, the World Sunday School Day is celebrated after the observation of Family Sunday. It speaks of the relationship between the two: family and children. Through wedlock a child is born in love and into love. God is the Creator, and therefore, God owns every life. At the same time, humans are called to be partners in creation with God with what God has given. Human beings are called for the right use of the divine gifts, and God the Creator shares in their joy.

A child is a gift of God to the parents and to the whole world. We read about baby Jesus in Luke 2: 40 that the child grew and became strong filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon Him. It is a God-given responsibility of parents to see that each child is nurtured in the above manner (cf. Luke 1: 80). When John the Baptist was christened, the people gathered and pondered, “What then will this child become?” This should be the question that the teachers should be asking when the parents send their children to Sunday school to come closer to Jesus. When the public had questions about spiritual life, Jesus pointed to a child and said, “...for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these.”

We hear lots of incidents where children are misused, abused, neglected, and forgotten. Malala Yousafzai, this year’s Nobel Peace Prize Laureate, is a teenager who lives and fights for the rights of female children’s education. She has found her vocation before she turned 18 years old. Can our homes and Sunday Schools nurture our children to find their vocation while they are in their adolescent years? May God help us!
