Vicar's message:

Dearly Beloved in Christ,

Warm greetings to you all in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Lord, our God provides perfect freedom, let us use our blessings meaningfully. As we enter the 11th month of the year 2017, may the Almighty Lord continue to bless you all. I would like to share a few thoughts from St. Matthew 12: 46 -50, V 50, "For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother".

In this passage Mathew reveals that on what makes a family in the context of the Kingdom of God. 1. **Obedience to the will of God:** Upon hearing that Jesus's mother and brother are standing outside, Jesus responds by talking what makes a family. A family, is basically formed through the obedience to God. It also demands intimacy of relationship. Obedience to God's will is what makes one Jesus' true brother, sister or mother.

2. **Complete dependence on Him.** A family is built on relationship. Relationship envisages mutuality and dependence. It is where we develop trust. Trust can be nurtured through togetherness. Jesus says who are my mother and brother? They are the ones who have full confidence in Him. Stretching out his hand, focusing on his disciples he says, they are his true brothers and sisters – those who depend on him and have trust in him. The kingdom of God demands our absolute obedience to the will of God. Let us pray that we may develop a life style that rekindles a family based on the Kingdom of God. (Every Day with the Word, 2017 July – October, P. 120).

As per the Church calendar, the first Sunday is being observed as *Kadosh Etho*- "Sanctification of the Church" with the theme

“Learning & Nurturing of the faith and practice”. The second is *Hudos Eetho* with the theme “Renewal of the Church”. The theme for the third Sunday is “Annunciation to Zachariah” , the fourth is “Annunciation to Virgin Mary”. We have to make time to meditate and reflect on these themes, so that these divinely inspired ideas for life will provide us all the spiritual nourishment and strength in the days to come.

The Thursday 23rd of this month is being observed as Thanks Giving Day. America has set apart the last Thursday of November as Thanksgiving Day as a sign of gratitude to God for preserving and prospering us as a nation and to remember how God took care of the pioneering immigrants/pilgrims who came from England in Mayflower and set up the colony at Plymouth. On this day, let us join with our fellow Americans to praise and thank god for his manifold blessings showered upon us as an immigrant community and as a church. **On the Thanksgiving Day, there will be special Holy Communion Service in English starting at 9 .30 a.m.**

Let us acknowledge God's presence and providence we experienced throughout the faith Journey, which are beyond our measure. Here I request your wholehearted prayer and support to all the activities of the Church. Since we are in the end of this year, as a faith community we submit ourselves in the mighty hands of God for and effective ministry that will be fruitful to all members of the Church.

As we move on, I seek your wholehearted co-operation and support towards our parish and its activities. May the crucified and the resurrected Lord be with us in our daily life, in our ministry and in all walks of life...

THANKSGIVING BECOMES AN OFFICIAL HOLIDAY

Pilgrims held their second Thanksgiving celebration in 1623 to mark the end of a long drought that had threatened the year's harvest and prompted Governor Bradford to call for a religious fast. Days of fasting and thanksgiving on an annual or occasional basis became common practice in other New England settlements as well. During the [American Revolution](#), the Continental Congress designated one or more days of thanksgiving a year, and in 1789 [George Washington](#) issued the first Thanksgiving proclamation by the national government of the United States; in it, he called upon Americans to express their gratitude for the happy conclusion to the country's war of independence and the successful ratification of the U.S. Constitution. His successors [John Adams](#) and [James Madison](#) also designated days of thanks during their presidencies.

In 1817, [New York](#) became the first of several states to officially adopt an annual Thanksgiving holiday; each celebrated it on a different day, however, and the American South remained largely unfamiliar with the tradition. In 1827, the noted magazine editor and prolific writer Sarah Josepha Hale—author, among

countless other things, of the nursery rhyme “Mary Had a Little Lamb”—launched a campaign to establish Thanksgiving as a national holiday. For 36 years, she published numerous editorials and sent scores of letters to governors, senators, presidents and other politicians. [Abraham Lincoln](#) finally heeded her request in 1863, at the height of the Civil War, in a proclamation entreating all Americans to ask God to “commend to his tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife” and to “heal the wounds of the nation.” He scheduled Thanksgiving for the final Thursday in November, and it was celebrated on that day every year until 1939, when [Franklin D. Roosevelt](#) moved the holiday up a week in an attempt to spur retail sales during the Great Depression. Roosevelt’s plan, known derisively as Franksgiving, was met with passionate opposition, and in 1941 the president reluctantly signed a bill making Thanksgiving the fourth Thursday in November.
